WHEREAS, both trailer parks had garbage and debris located all over the grounds, over years of accumulation, at the time of county acquisition, and

WHEREAS, Douglas County utilized its Highway Department's services to clean up much of the accumulated debris, and

WHEREAS, both trailer parks have numerous mobile home trailers located on premise that are dilapidated and unsafe and may have asbestos or other contaminants, and

WHEREAS, to further clean up the properties and sell, Douglas County advertised them for bid, with no minimum bid, but requirement of execution of an agreement for purchase and performance bond, on June 9, 16, and 23, 2023, with no bids received, and

WHEREAS, the properties were advertised a second time on July 7, 14, and 21, 2023, with the same requirements as the original ad; one non-compliant bid and one non-compliant proposal received and rejected by the Land and Development Committee, and

WHEREAS, the Land and Development Committee recommended funding the clean-up and removal of trailers through ARPA dollars to the Administration Committee, and

WHEREAS, the Administration Committee agreed with the Land and Development Committee recommendation in approving up to \$200,000 in ARPA funds for the clean-up and removal of mobile home trailers on the properties.

BE IT RESOLVED, that due to the winter season soon approaching, time is of the essence for the final clean-up and removal of mobile home trailers on these properties.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Douglas County Board of Supervisors accepts the recommendation of the Land and Development and Administration Committees to fund the clean-up and removal of mobile home trailers on both North and South Country Acres Trailer Park properties from ARPA dollars, not to exceed \$200,000.
