How can I pay?
You have several options
to make the payment

1. Pay By Mail

WE ACCEPT POSTMARK!

Make your check payable to the **Douglas County Treasurer**, write your tax parcel number and phone number on the check and enclose the payment stub (the bottom portion of your Real Property Tax Bill) If you want a receipt, enclose a self-address, stamped envelope and mail to

2. Dropbox

Payments may also be placed in the Douglas County Treasurer's drop box in front of the Government Center. If you want a receipt, enclose a self-address, stamped envelope

3. Pay Online

The Treasurer offers residents the option to pay online but it will cost 2.39% for Credit Card payments or \$1.50 for E-Checks.

4. Pay In Person

Monday-Friday, 8 AM-4:30PM

We no longer take credit cards at the counter.

If there is a line, for your convenience we have a small drop box in the hallway. But please no cash in the box!
(We will mail you a receipt.)

What happens if I pay late?

By State law, if you fail to pay the amount of your second installment by **July 31, 2021** the balance becomes delinquent and will accrue interest at a rate of 1% per month (calculated from February 1 2021) until the delinquent amount is paid in full. The payment **must be either postmarked by July 31st or received by the treasurer within 5 working days of the due day.**

Postmarks after July 31st and not received in our office within the 5 day grace period are considered late.

What if I can't pay my entire installment amount?

It is in your best interest and we encourage everyone to try and pay as much as you can by the due date to minimize interest due.

Continuing to make monthly payments until your entire balance is paid in full will help to reduce the amount of interest you will pay and reduce the risk of falling behind and potentially losing your property.
